Explore **"integrity"** through these books, available from the Spokane County Library*



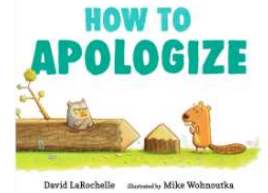
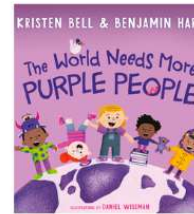
DO

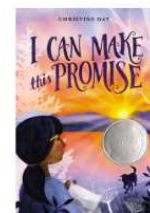
